Letter of Understanding

Purpose of the 88CHARLIES Program

The mission of 88CHARLIES is to use the empowering experience of restoring and flying vintage airplanes to teach young people responsibility, leadership, planning, and teamwork. It is our goal to motivate students to expand their knowledge of aviation, science, technology, engineering, mathematics, and history through aircraft restoration. through aircraft restoration.

Reward of Flight Training Hours

- 1. Students shall be a minimum of 12 years of age to earn Flight Credits.
- 2. 88CHARLIES will award an introductory flight to an enrolled student after the completion of 20 hours of approved work under the direction of an 88CHARLIES Member or Director. The work shall be recorded and verified by an 88CHARLIES Founder prior to starting any flight time.
- 3. After the student has completed the initial 20 hours, an additional hour of Flight Credit will be awarded to the student for 20 hours of project work or assignments issued by an 88CHARLIES Director.
- 4. Flight Credits shall expire 6 months after the student graduates from high school.
- 5. For those students using their Flight Credits toward flight training, the following applies:
 - a. This program will provide up to 60 hours of flight training for the student to obtain a Pilot Certificate. The student is required to pass their FAA Written Exam prior to the completion of 15 hours of flight time.
 - b. Flight training will stop at 15 hours until the student has passed the FAA Written Exam. This program is designed to aid students in acquiring a Pilot Certificate. Passing the Ground School Written Exam with the FAA is a vital part of the certification process. It is important the student be diligent in the early training process to complete the FAA Written Exam.
 - c. Certified Flight Instructors approved by 88CHARLIES will perform all flight instruction
 - d. The minimum age for the initiation of flight instruction is 15 years.
 - e. Flight training will be available to the completion of the Private Pilot Certification, or a maximum of 60 hours







Letter of Understanding (Continued)

Ground School Recommendations

- 1. Take a ground school course through 88CHARLIES Inc. or another professional training organization.
- 2. The King School course on disk is a great option, however it takes much commitment to stick with it and complete it in a timely fashion.
- 3. Gleim books offers a great book with practice tests that act as a beneficial study aid for the FAA Written Fxam.
- 4. Start early, team up with other companions and study together.
- 5. Ask your Flight Instructor for the best way to study and pass the FAA Written Exam. The written exam is the most grueling part of earning the Pilot Certificate. Passing the exam early gets the tough part out of the way.
- 6. Many tasks are involve din learning to fly aircraft. Lessons proceed first with a short review of what was learned in their previous lessons. If you preform well and remember the tasks, then the Flight Instructor will move on to new lessons and subjects. If you do not fly often, for example a minimum of an hour a week, much of the skill you have practiced on the previous lesson may be lost. This results in more review of the last lesson and less new learning material. Attempt o fly at least on hour a week; it will not only speed our education, you will enjoy it much more as well.
