Palmyra, Wisconsin (February 20, 2017) - Kathryn Brenner, of northern Illinois, has received a full flight training scholarship from Able Flight. Through this scholarship, Kathryn will be training at Purdue University. Upon completion of the intensive training, she will be a guest of honor and receive her Able Flight Wings on stage at EAA AirVenture in Oshkosh later this year, just weeks after becoming a licensed pilot.

Kathryn has been a student at 88CHARLIES since November of last year, and dedicatedly attends the weekly workshops on Saturday mornings. She has been quite involved in the latest 88CHARLIES restoration project, "Greenie," which is a 1979 Blanca Citabria. "Greenie" is anticipated to be complete by July of this year, just in time to be present at EAA AirVenture when Kathryn is to receive her wings.
